
Worship Focus: Followers of Christ Obey His Law from the Heart

A loving father gives his son and daughter a list of rules and regulations. Chores, curfews, civilities, dress code—the father makes his will clearly known. The son strives to follow the rules because he wants to get his allowance and he is afraid that if he breaks the rules, his father will punish him. The daughter strives to follow the rules because she believes her father established those rules not to control her but for her safety and blessing. She also wants to demonstrate how much she loves and trusts her father. Those two children's actions might look almost identical but their hearts are very different! Likewise, following Christ is not simply a matter of outward observance of laws. It is a matter of the heart. The Law was given so we could see God's heart and demonstrate how his heart has affected our own. The "followership" that Christ seeks flows from hearts that have been radically transformed by God's law and gospel. Followers of Christ obey his law from the heart.



Second Reading Romans 9:30 -10:4


Sola Fide is our 2024-25 school year theme. There is no room for pride. We are saved by faith alone!

³⁰ What shall we say then? That Gentiles, who were not pursuing righteousness, have obtained righteousness, a righteousness that is by faith. ³¹ But Israel, while pursuing the law as a way of righteousness, did not reach it. ³² Why? Because they kept pursuing it not by faith, but as if it comes by works. They stumbled over the stumbling stone. ³³ Just as it is written: Look, I am putting a stone in Zion over which they will stumble and a rock over which they will fall. The one who believes in him will not be put to shame. ¹⁰ Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God on behalf of the Israelites is that they may be saved. ² Indeed, I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but it is not consistent with knowledge. ³ Since they were ignorant of the righteousness from God and sought to establish their own righteousness, they did not submit to the righteousness from God. ⁴ For to everyone who believes, Christ is the end of the law, resulting in righteousness.

Is your heart clean or unclean? God spare us from the deception of self-righteousness!

¹The Pharisees and some of the experts in the law came from Jerusalem and gathered around Jesus. ² They saw some of his disciples eating bread with unclean (that is, unwashed) hands. ³ In fact, the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they scrub their hands with a fist, holding to the tradition of the elders. 4When they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash. And there are many other traditions they adhere to, such as the washing of cups, pitchers, kettles, and dining couches. ⁵ The Pharisees and the experts in the law asked Jesus, "Why do your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders? Instead they eat bread with unclean hands." ⁶He answered them, "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites. As it is written: These people honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me. ⁷They worship me in vain, teaching human rules as if they were doctrines. 8 "You abandon God's commandment but hold to human tradition like the washing of pitchers and cups, and you do many other such things." ¹⁴He called the crowd to him again and said, "Everyone, listen to me and understand. 15 There is nothing outside of a man that can make him unclean by going into him. But the things that come out of a man are what make a man unclean. ²¹ In fact, from within, out of people's hearts, come evil thoughts, sexual sins, theft, murder, ²² adultery, greed, wickedness, deceit, unrestrained immorality, envy, slander, arrogance, and foolishness. ²³ All these evil things proceed from within and make a person unclean."



New Sunday Bible Study Opportunity

Beginning Sunday, September 8 at 8:45 am



Is it possible for the Christian faith to survive and thrive in a world that's indifferent at best and hostile at worst? What does such a faith look like – at home, at work, and in the community? And what kind of church does it take to sustain that vision? St. Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians helps us with questions like these. He writes to strengthen the early

believers' faith in Jesus. In a godless society, St. Paul helps them 'to serve the living and true God' (1:9) – where holiness is not withdrawal from the world but involvement in it in a new way, marked by faith, love, and hope.

What you will take home:

Strength to face the challenges of living your faith and peace knowing that all rests in Jesus hands.




