Worship Focus: Love Your Enemies, Overcoming Evil with Good

Throughout this season of Epiphany, Jesus has described the governing principles of his kingdom being completely opposite to the governing principles of the world. This week Jesus asks us to befriend our enemies, to love those who hate us, and to repay evil with good. Worldly logic would say that is a recipe for being walked all over. Yet haven't we seen this tactic work? When we were Christ's enemies, he loved us to the point of death. He repays our daily wrongs with the daily goodness of his mercy. In doing so, he won us for himself.


Here is the epiphany we badly need to have. Following the strategy Jesus lays out—loving our enemies—is not a capitulation to evil. It is a means of conquering it.








The account of Joseph forgiving his brothers after they had sold him into slavery demonstrates that God overcomes evil with good.


³ Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still alive?" His brothers could not answer him, because they were terrified by his presence. ⁴ Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me, please." They came closer. He said, "I am Joseph, your brother, whom you sold into Egypt. 5 Now do not be upset or angry with yourselves for selling me to this place, since God sent me ahead of you to preserve life. ⁶ For two years now the famine has been in the land, and there are still five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. ⁷ God sent me ahead of you to preserve you as survivors on the earth, and to keep you alive by a great act of deliverance. 8 So it was not you who sent me here, but God, and he has made me a father to Pharaoh, lord over his entire household, and ruler over the whole land of Egypt. ⁹ Hurry, go up to my father and tell him, 'This is what your son Joseph says: "God has made me lord of all Egypt. Your eyes and the eyes of my brother Benjamin see that it is my mouth that speaks to you. ¹³ You shall tell my father all about my position of honor in Egypt and about everything that you have seen. Hurry and bring my father down here." ¹⁴He threw his arms around his brother Benjamin's neck and wept, and Benjamin wept on his shoulder. 15 He kissed all his brothers and wept over them. After that his brothers talked with him.

Pray for those who mistreat you. ²⁹ If someone strikes you on one cheek, offer the other too. If someone takes away your coat, do not withhold your shirt. ³⁰ Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes away your things, do not demand them back. ³¹ "Treat others just as you would want them to treat you. ³² If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? To be sure, even the sinners love those who love them. ³³ And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Feed My People, Lakeshore CAP and HELP of Door County, Inc. are very appreciative and thankful for the items they receive. The dates for both collections have been extended this year to include two weekend services.

Food Donations: March 7 through March 17

We will be collecting nonperishable food items. These items will be donated to Feed My People and Lakeshore CAP. In addition, some of the items we collect will be used to stock the Blessings Box located on Maple Street in front of church. The Blessings Box is stocked as needed by Kary however, anyone is welcome to add temperature sensitive food and personal care items to the Blessings Box throughout the year. Suggested nonperishable food item donations include jams and jellies, crackers, tuna, rice mixes, miscellaneous soups, cake mixes, packaged dinners, box mixes like Hamburger Helper and Tuna Helper, Ramen and other noodle types and other nonperishable food.

Personal Care/Cleaning Product Donations: March 18 through March 31

We will be collecting personal care and cleaning products. Items collected will be donated to HELP of Door County, Inc. Suggested items are full size (not sample size) of toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, liquid hand soap (no bar soap), body and face wash, hair spray and hair gel, shaving cream, baby wash, baby shampoo, diapers, feminine products, deodorant, band aids, toilet paper and Kleenex. Suggested cleaning supply items include all purpose cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, dish soap, paper towels and laundry detergent.

Ash Wednesday and the Lenten Season begin March 5. In our midweek Lenten worship this year, various pastors from our Wisconsin Synod Door-Kewaunee churches will speak on the Theme – *Reflections on Repentance* looking at Psalm 51.

"The Lord is not slow to do what he promised.... Instead, he is patient for your sakes, not wanting anyone to perish, but all to come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). Luther began his famous debate theses noting that Scripture's call to repentance is intended as a way of life. Using David's great penitential Psalm 51, our Midweek Lenten Worship explores the depths of our sinful depravity, the brokenness of our relationship with God, our dire need for






