Series Theme: The Need for Follower-ship

"We need better leadership!" Have you ever said that? Perhaps you were frustrated with the direction being taken by some elected official or by management at your workplace or by the coach of your favorite team. You were frustrated because you know that no matter how many resources an organization has, it will flounder if leaders do not lead well: providing direction, training, motivation, coordination, encouragement, and even grace. Leadership is extremely important. And so, there are times we lament, "We need better leadership!" Jesus Christ is the leader of our congregation, our home, our lives. And his leadership is perfect in every way. Therefore, when things are amiss in any of those arenas, what is needed is not better leadership, but better followership. In this series, we ask Christ to empower us with his Spirit so that we might better follow his lead. May we better reflect the beauty of his life, better make his priorities our own, and better serve our God and neighbor.

Worship Focus: Followers of Christ See the True Purpose of His Power

Power is neither inherently good nor bad. Fire is powerful. The chef uses fire to create meals. But the arsonist uses fire to destroy homes. Nuclear fission is a powerful force. The engineer harnesses it, producing abundant electricity. The tyrant harnesses it, threating others with nuclear weapons. What matters is the purpose of the one who has that power.

Jesus has limitless power, as the numerous accounts of his miracles demonstrate. Those who witnessed those miracles understood that Jesus used his power for good. That doesn't mean they all understood Jesus' true purpose. Some thought Jesus' purpose was to make this temporal life better. And while Jesus did that at times, his ultimate purpose was to save us from sin and give us the gift of eternal life. Followers of Christ see the true purpose of his power.






Our eyes are opened to God's Word

Peter and John were going up to the temple at the ninth hour, an hour of prayer. ²A certain man who was lame from birth was carried there every day and placed at the temple gate, which is called Beautiful, so that he could beg for donations from those entering the temple. ³ When he saw Peter and John about to enter the temple, he asked them for a donation. ⁴ Peter looked directly at him, as did John. Peter said, "Look at us." ⁵ So the man paid close attention to them, expecting to receive something from them. ⁶ But Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I will give you. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, get up and walk!" ⁷ Peter took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately the man's feet and ankles were made strong. ⁸ Jumping up, he stood and began to walk. He entered the temple courts with them, walking, jumping, and praising God. ⁹ All the people saw him walking and praising God. ¹⁰ They recognized him as the one who used to sit begging for money at the Beautiful Gate of the temple, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.



St. Peter's Lunch Program News from Mrs. Joni Vertz

School is starting soon and the cupboards are bare! Would you be willing to help fill the pantry before school starts? With your help, we can restock it. Please consider donating these items: large cans Bush Baked Beans, tomato paste, ketchup, granola bars, instant dry milk, raisins, graham crackers, vegetable oil, sliced black olives, marshmallows, lemon juice, spaghetti, egg noodles, Manwich sauce, Golden Grahams cereal, dill pickles, chocolate chips, pudding mixes (vanilla, chocolate, lemon), Sweet Baby Ray's BBQ sauce, cake mixes (any flavor), white frosting, refried beans, goldfish crackers, salsa, animal crackers, Ziploc bags: (snack, quart, and gallon size bags), large crockpot liners. SCRIP Program: Did you know that if you buy gift cards from our SCRIP program, that a portion of all proceeds goes straight to Tuition, either for a specified family or just a general tuition fund? If you are going to be buying some of these things from stores anyways, why not get as much bang for your buck if you can, and help your School out with no extra hassle! Gift certificates from our SCRIP program for Maas Floral automatically donate 5% to St. Peter's? If you need fixing up done around the house and will be using Walmart, Ace or Menards and purchase SCRIP cards from St. Peter's, 3%, 4% and 3% (respectively) will be donated right back to Us. If you need to pick up prescriptions or



other items from Walgreens, 5% will be donated. Hungry? Jimmy Johns gift cards donate back 20% to us! Some of our other highest donations are cards from Kitty O'Reillys, Wienke's Market and Scaturo's. All 10% back! Did you also know that even if you have grandchildren or kids that are too young to start school, that you can start building your Tuition assistance now and we'll keep it for when they start? Welcoming Children in Worship

Mark 10:14 (Jesus) said to them. "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs."

Public Worship is one of the basic ways people learn what it means to be Christian. Children learn worship by worshipping with the congregation Sunday after Sunday.

- They learn they belong to Christ and are welcome in His Church.
- They learn to know the Lord's Prayer and other parts of the liturgy from memory.
- They build a fund of memorable, shared experiences of Christian community against which they may draw when they are older.
- They are enriched by the beauty of music and art as expressions of praise and thanks to God.
- They hear stories from the Bible read and interpreted, and begin to see Christian worship as one place where God may speak to them.



- They witness the celebration of Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper as God comes to nourish His people with forgiveness.
- They discover that they are valued by God and by the people of God at Church.

Keeping all this in mind, St. Peters looks to encourage and welcome children at our weekend public worship.

Is it possible for the Christian faith to survive and thrive in a world that's indifferent at best and hostile at worst? What does such a faith look like – at home, at work, and in the community? And what kind of church does it take to sustain that vision? St. Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians helps us with questions like these. He writes to strengthen the early

believers' faith in Jesus. In a godless society, St. Paul helps them 'to serve the living and true God' (1:9) – where holiness is not withdrawal from the world but involvement in it in a new way, marked by faith, love, and hope.

What you will take home:

Strength to face the challenges of living your faith and peace knowing that all rests in Jesus hands.

Isaiah 35:4-7 Be Strong


Summary: Isaiah 35:4-7a delves into the theme of fear and reassurance. Fear is a common human experience, but great fear stems from separation from God due to sin. The solution? God's forgiveness and salvation in Jesus. For the Israelites, God spoke His judgement upon sin, but also the promise of redemption through the Savior. This promise was fulfilled in Jesus Christ, who comes to remove fear by offering eternal life and peace. Like the Israelites, so also you. The solution to fear is found in Jesus and His forgiveness. By focusing on Jesus and growing in faith through learning His Word, you also are strong in Him.


Family Devotion - Devotions written specifically for families available in text and audio formats. Find inspiration, resources, and spiritual growth for all ages.
